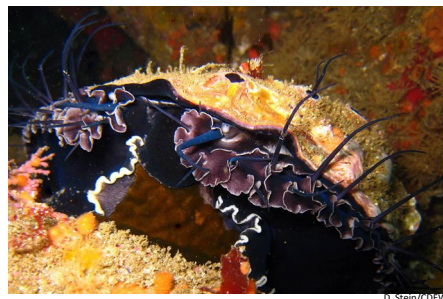
All members of the North Central Coast ocean community are welcome, including those interested in the monitoring, evaluation, and management of the region's MPAs and oceans.
